




Characterize the synovial environment of patients undergoing arthroscopic chondroplasty


Synovial fluid aspiration at time of surgery



Conclusion

Elevated inflammatory cytokines appear to be the driving force behind worse baseline KOOS Symptom and QOL subscores

Number of defects and sex are independently correlated with the synovial profile of the patient

Future Area of Study: Investigation of the effect of inflammatory cytokines on the healing environment after OCA
